

Pre-Kindergarten Update

January 2024

Academic Focus

During December 2023 students in pre-k explored the *Buildings Study*. They built upon prior knowledge to create and extend patterns, used their fine motor skills to assemble small and large manipulatives, and used measurement tools. Students investigated what the buildings in their neighborhoods look like, who builds buildings, and what tools they use to build them. They made predictions and tested ideas about what are buildings made of, what makes them strong, what's special about school buildings, and what happens inside of buildings.



Markham Park- Ms. Naggles

After reading *The Story of the Three Little Pigs*, students conducted a STEM project in which they were given Dot's candies and toothpicks. Students were instructed to build a home that would protect the pigs from the big bad wolf. The following day students assisted Ms. Jackson with using a blow dryer (big bad wolf) to attempt to blow their homes down.

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STEAM Academy- Ms. Willis

Ms. Willis strongly encouraged her families to study their homes and neighborhood for the December 2023 family project. At home, students were assisted with recreating their homes and the buildings in their neighborhoods. They presented their finished projects to the class, where they had to point out special characteristics about each building.



Chateaux- Ms. Brown

Technology was incorporated into the Pre-K curriculum at Chateaux as Coach Butcher assisted our students with coding on the classroom iPads.



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Nob Hill - Ms. Crawford

On December 14, 2023 students from the Distributive Education Clubs of America, DECA Program, at Hillcrest High School visited Nob Hill's pre-k classroom. The emerging leaders and future entrepreneurs, completed a craft with our preschoolers, engaged in conversation, music and movement, provided lunch, and gifted them with Christmas presents.
